Pierre-Michel Menger, Patron of the 2025-2026 Cohort of Fellows at the Paris Institute for Advanced Study

The Paris Institute for Advanced Study is pleased to announce that **Pierre-Michel Menger**, sociologist and Professor Emeritus at the Collège de France, will serve as the **patron of the 2025-2026 cohort of resident fellows**.

Pierre-Michel Menger completed his secondary education in Forbach and Strasbourg before being admitted to the École normale supérieure on rue d'Ulm, where he studied philosophy and then sociology. He was a fellow at the Fondation Thiers between 1978 and 1981, where he completed his doctoral thesis at EHESS.

He joined the CNRS in 1981, pursuing his career there as research fellow and later research director, and was awarded the CNRS Silver Medal in 1999. Since 2013, he has been Professor at the Collège de France, holding the Chair of the Sociology of Creative Work. He has also been teaching at EHESS as Directeur d'études cumulant since 1995. He was elected a member of the Academia Europaea in 2010 and of the Académie des Sciences Morales et Politiques in 2023.

His current research focuses on education, careers in research and higher education, meritocracy and its controversies, as well as the creative process in the arts.
